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ANNIVERSARIES



We celebrate the following former Aussie players at Roland Garros

65 YEARS

Neale Fraser and Roy Emerson won the men's doubles, and Bob Howe claimed the mixed in 1954.

60 YEARS

In 1965, Fred Stolle won his first Roland Garros singles crown before teaming up with Roy Emerson to claim the men's doubles. Lesley (Turner) Bowrey won the women's singles, going on to also win the women's doubles alongside Margaret Court. Court won the mixed doubles with Ken Fletcher.

55 YEARS

Margaret Court won the women's singles title in 1970.

40 YEARS

Mark Edmonson and Kim Warwick won the men's doubles in 1985.

30 YEARS

In 1995, Mark Woodforde won the mixed doubles title.

25 YEARS

Todd Woodbridge and Mark Woodforde claimed their first and only Roland Garros men's doubles crown in 2000.



ROLAND GARROS 2025

- The 129th edition of Roland Garros will be contested in 2025, with 56.3 million Euros in prizemoney, up 5.21% on 2024
- 13 Australian players have received direct acceptance into the Roland Garros 2025 singles draws
- Destanee Aiava and Tristan Schoolkate have been awarded wildcards
- Roland Garros will honour Rafael Nadal, Mary Pierce and Richard Gasquet this year.
- Nadal will take part in a ceremony on Sunday 25 May, with an exhibition celebrating the Spaniard to run for the duration of the tournament.
- The tournament will commemorate the 25th anniversary of Pierce's twin titles on Centre Court on 5 June, before inducting her into the International Tennis Hall of Fame.
- AO25 Top Gun ballkids Adelle Kao (15) and Will Cartwright (14) will join the Roland Garros ballkid program as part of an exchange program.
- Gasquet, who will be playing in his 22nd and final Roland Garros, will be honoured at the conclusion of his final match.
- A free fan zone on Place de la Concorde will be open from 4-9 June with capacity for 5000 spectators.
- Opening Week will return following record attendance in 2024. Suzanne-Lenglen court will host one match per day and the public will be able to watch players practice on Centre Court.
- Yannick Noah Day, the tournament's charity day, will take place on 25 May.
- "Everyone in a Wheelchair" will put a spotlight on wheelchair tennis on Friday 6 June. The inclusive tennis weekend will include tennis for the deaf and hard of hearing, blind tennis and adapted sport tennis.

Tier 1 clay-court facilities in Australia

- Tennis Australia recognises the benefits of training on clay as a crucial part of developing young athletes and has grown the number of Tier 1 clay court facilities in the country from just one in the late 1990s to 68 at present. The majority of facility development has taken place since 2012.
- A total of 33 Tier 1 clay courts are installed at National Academy venues across the country.
